

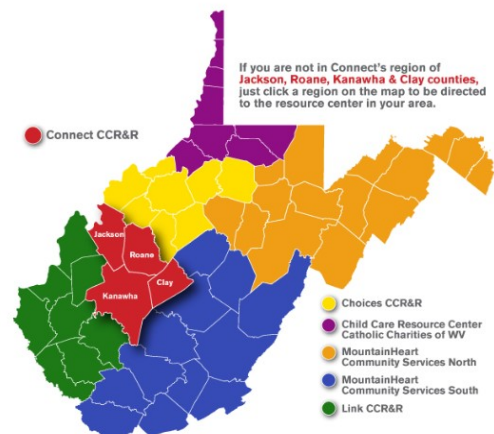

ACDS Virtual Classes

ACDS now has both in-person and virtual classes. Areas that do not offer in-person classes have priority in registering for virtual classes. Students attending virtually will attend either a live 2.5 hour session with their instructor or a 1 hour session and take the course content on WV STARS. All students complete the same registration process.

To register for class:

1. Complete the orientation that corresponds to the semester you want to register for. All four semesters have an orientation. The orientations can be found by searching self-paced courses on the WV STARS training calendar.
2. Submit \$25.00 registration fee. ACDS accepts checks, money orders, debit and credit cards. Checks and money orders are made payable to RVCDS. To pay with a card you must complete a credit card transaction form that is on the ACDS website, www.wvacds.org. This completed form can be mailed or emailed.

Both steps of the registration process need completed by the registration deadline date, which is determined before each semester. For more information please contact the ACDS office.

STARS Policy Reminder

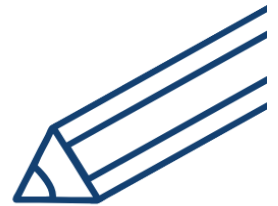
Beginning January 1, 2020 the following WV STARS Policy will take affect:

In order to receive training credit hours for a repeating face-to-face course, it has to have been at minimum 12 months since this course has been previously completed. *This provision is not applicable to Technical Assistance (TA) sessions offered by the Resource and Referral Agencies.* Individuals choosing to repeat a course again inside the twelve-month period will be treated as a student auditing a course and will be marked as completed but will receive

no training credit hours.

All courses offered as face-to-face or webinar courses will be subject to this change. Please note self-paced courses are not repeatable for credit.

We hope that this change will encourage the early childhood professionals of West Virginia to take intentional professional development to further their knowledge and skills.

Professional Development Session Descriptions

A New Dawn Everyone is committed to the value that all children deserve to grow to their fullest potential. Anti-bias education will help support the children in your care, their families, and your coworkers. A New Dawn will examine anti-bias education and the goals that go along with it. This training will discuss how anti-bias education goals can help children, as well as adults. We will discuss having those brave conversations with children about anti-bias issues and the importance of anti-bias education.

A Hero's Journey: Character Development for School-Aged Children This 1-hour online training will introduce participants to Character Development and focuses on the strategies for teaching character development to school-aged children. Participants will learn the importance of character development and strategies for teaching character development to school-aged children.

Fill in the Gaps: Planning Transitions in Afterschool Programs. This training will discuss the benefits of planning smooth transitions in the classroom. The training will also offer strategies to implement in the classroom to reduce children's wait time and offer more time for engagement to enhance children's learning and development. There will be examples provided to encourage teachers to plan to assist in smooth transitions. The training will also introduce the use of choice boards. Choice boards help offer structure and consistency in the program as well as fosters children's independence by allowing them to choose from the activities or interest areas offered.

Fine Motor Fun PK This one hour online session will focus on the value of providing fine motor play for preschoolers. We will examine activities to incorporate fine motor skill practice in daily planning and discuss the lifetime benefits fine motor play can provide young learners.

How To's With Social Stories Social stories are created and used in a lot of different situations. They can help with things from difficult behaviors in the classroom to routine changes. How To's With Social Stories will help define social stories and explore how social stories can be used. This training will also examine the benefits of using social stories and will go over the process of creating your own social story.

Intentional Teaching and Play PK Come plan and play! This online session will examine the importance of creating an intentional "play-full" preschool environment. Discussion will include the benefits of purposeful planning and ways to facilitate hands-on learning through intentional play opportunities. We will connect the WV PreK standards to these child-based learning experiences that promote independence and individual growth.

Inviting Interest Centers PK This two hour in person preschool session will investigate the importance of providing high quality interest centers in the preschool setting. We will discuss materials to be included in the classroom's interest areas to help motivate and extend learning of each child.

Leadership In Action This training is designed for Directors or individuals in a child care administration role. The session will cover the skills and competencies required for effective leadership and support with understanding the values and beliefs that shape leadership behaviors. Participants will also have a chance to assess their unique leadership style and learn how to use authority to empower and support others.

Let's Get Physical This training is going to look at ways to get school-aged children moving in the classroom. Incorporating gross motor in your daily schedules and ways to do it even with the weather being bad. Even when teachers have very limited indoor space, this training will explore ways to keep school-aged children moving in order to promote healthy life-styles and ample opportunities for physical activity. Participants will learn about obesity in West Virginia and ways to incorporate physical activity into their daily routine.

Professional Development Session Descriptions

Let's Get Ready To Rumble: Benefits of Rough and Tumble Play This 1-hour online training will introduce participants to Rough and Tumble Play and its benefits. Participants will learn about the relationship between rough and tumble play and social emotional development in children. Participants will also learn about developing a "boy friendly" classroom.

Little Scientists: Exploring Science in Early Childhood This training will focus on science for children. Participants will learn the basics of science, how and what children learn from science, how important science is in the program and how science can be found throughout the childhood environment.

Open Ended Art PK This two hour in person preschool training will examine open-ended art activities and discuss how art has the ability to enhance all areas of a child's development. Participants will have an opportunity to get creative and receive resources to extend classroom art experiences.

Operation ELSF This training will explore the ELSF-IT as a whole document and how to utilize it. We will dissect the document into its building blocks and identify the purpose, benefits, and specific outcomes of the ELSF-IT. We will use that information to translate the ELSF-IT into individualized, purposeful planning. We will explore what an individualized lesson plan looks like and how to construct one using the ELSF-IT and observation.

The Melting Pot If you look for diversity, you will see it everywhere! Even when all or most of the children appear to come from the same cultural group, there are differences within the group. This training is going to examine anti-bias classrooms and materials. Culture, race, gender, economic status, and family make up are part of creating an inclusive classroom. This training will also explore the TRAILS program and how this can enhance your classroom environment. The toys, materials and equipment you put out for children influence what children learn. What children do not see in the classroom, teaches them as much as what they do see.

The Perfect Playbook This training will showcase the importance of lesson plans in family childcare programs. The training will not only look at the benefits, but also break down the parts of the lesson plans. This training will practice creating lesson plans for both group planning and individualized planning for providers who care for infants and toddlers. This training will also touch on the WV Early Learning Standards Framework for both infants and toddlers as well as preschool.

Rocking to the Beat in Early Childhood This training is going to discuss how to create a music center in your classroom. The training will discuss circle time activities and other ways to bring music into your classroom. Transitions with music will also be discussed. The training will explore what musical options the TRAILS program has to offer as well as creating your own musical instruments with items from home.

Teaching for Change Now more than ever there is a need for Early Childhood providers to be responsive to the diversity within their programs. Teaching for Change will explore guidelines for planning a classroom environment rich in anti-bias curriculum. The session will also highlight ways to create an inclusive, secure, and supportive environment for all families.

Spaces That Grow This training will explore quality spaces and how to make them meaningful. We will explore the messages our environments send and how they can impact our experiences. This will be done by understanding the relationship between the physical environment and Infant-Toddler behavior and learning. Additionally, we will plan and prepare a learning environment that nurtures children's initiative and encourages active exploration of materials
